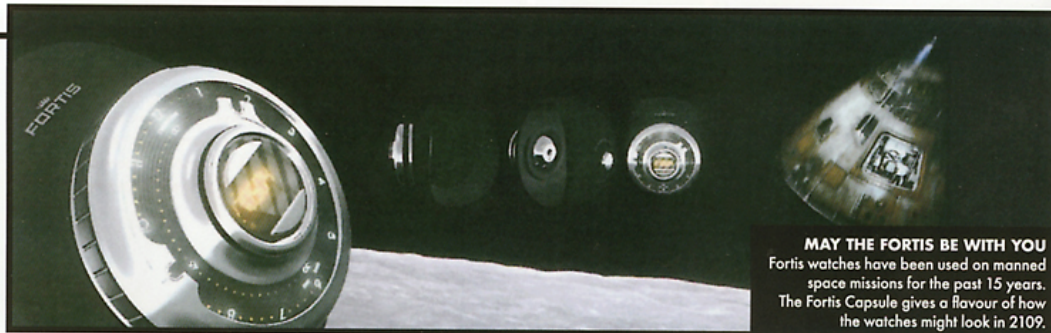

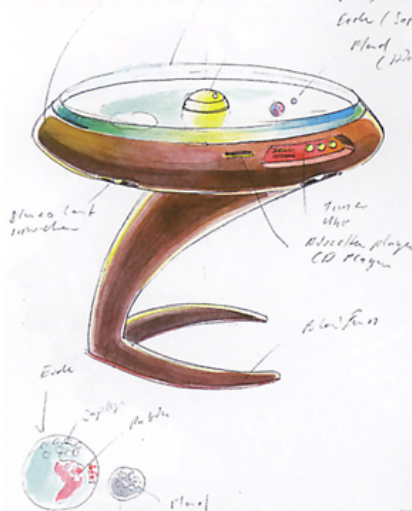

## MAY THE FORTIS BE WITH YOU

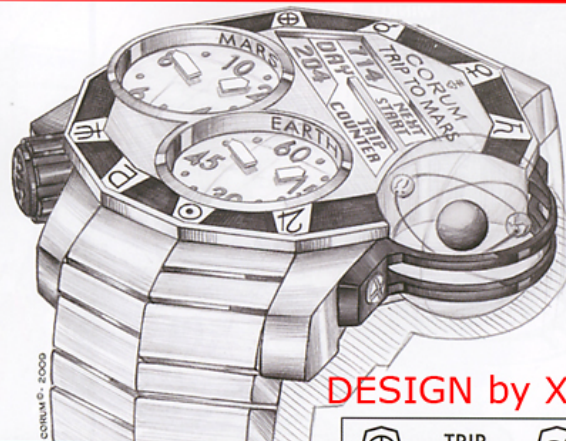
Fortis watches have been used on manned space missions for the past 15 years. The Fortis Capsule gives a flavour of how the watches might look in 2109.

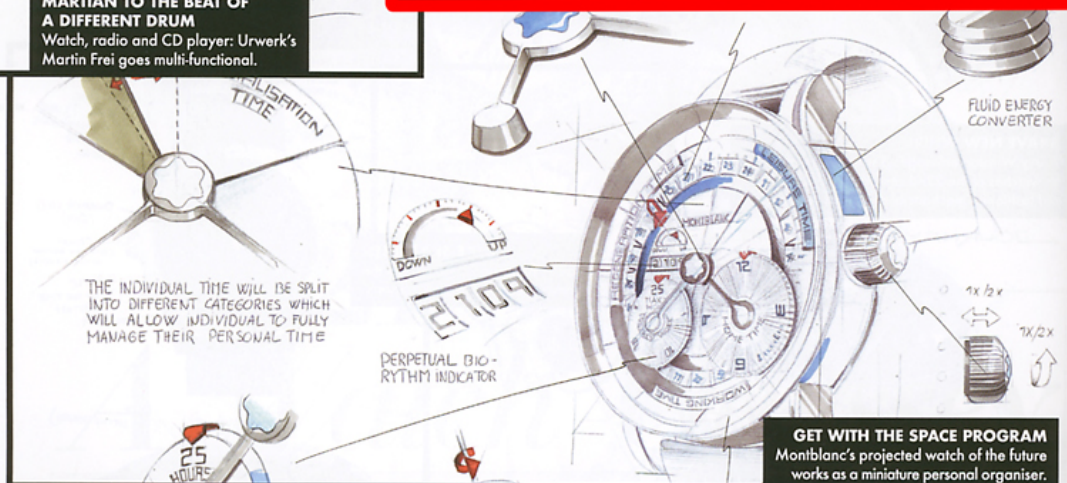

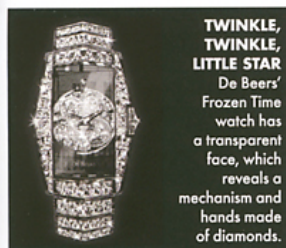
### WHOA, TRIPPY!

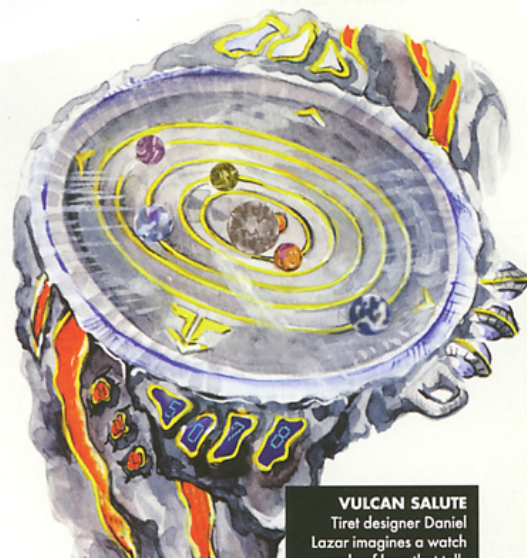
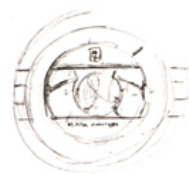
